**Series: The Way, Living like a Saint**

**Message description:**

## Questions Related to This Week's Message:

1. When you think of the power of generosity, who do you think of and why?
2. Were you familiar with the story of St. Nicholas prior to the teaching? What do you appreciate about his story? How could we more faithfully remember his witness and legacy during Advent?
3. What keeps you from being more generous with your time, money, and service?
4. Why do you think giving financially is important to our spiritual lives and spiritual health?
5. How can/does giving to Revolution Church make you more aware of the needs of your neighbors?

## Going Deeper:

### Re-read Matthew 6:1-4

- What stands out to you about this teaching from Jesus?
- Why do you think it is so easy to fall into the temptation to give for recognition or adoration?
- How does this relate to our passage last week from Luke 11:37-52 regarding the Pharisees and the ritual of washing externally before dinner but failing to cleanse the greed and wickedness from within?
- How does this relate to the teaching of Jesus earlier in the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5:16? How is it similar or different to Jesus' instructions on giving here?
- How can we be sure we are giving with the right intent when we do it?

### Examples of Psalms of Re-orientation:

Community Thanksgiving: Psalms 65, 67, 75, 107, 124, 136

Individual Thanksgiving: Psalms 18, 21, 30, 32, 34, 40:1-11, 66:13-20, 92, 108, 116, 118, 138

Hymns of Praise – in which we praise God for who God is, Psalms 8, 19:1-6, 33, 66:1-12, 67, 95, 100, 103, 104, 111, 113, 114, 117, 145, 146, 147, 148, 149, 150

Songs of Zion – in which we praise God for His presence in the ancient city of Jerusalem, and the way it points to His presence at the center of the Kingdom of God. [Psalms 46, 48, 76, 84, 87, 122]

Royal/Enthronement Psalms – in which we consider the role of Kings in Ancient Israel. [Psalms 2, 18, 20, 21, 29, 45, 47, 72, 93, 95, 96, 97, 98, 99, 101, 110, 144]

Covenant Renewal – in which we renew our relationship with God. [Psalms 50, 78, 81, 89, 132]
