Series: Good News of Great Joy

The theme of joy comes up over and over again in the Christmas story. People experienced joy in times of darkness, uncertainty, and challenges back then, and we can too still today. Join us this Advent as we explore the moments of deep joy found throughout the story of Christmas in Luke and discover ways to cultivate that joy today. In this series, we don't just want to talk about joy, we actually want to practice experiencing joy in community together. Make plans to join us for one of the many ways we hope to experience the joy of Christmas this year!

Message description:

Joy shows up for Mary in the meeting of the mothers. After her visit from the angel Gabriel, Mary retreats to the hill country to find courage and comfort with her cousin, Elizabeth, who is also expecting. Scripture says Elizabeth's child leapt for joy at the presence of Mary, the mother of the lord. In times of uncertainty, fear, and confusion, joy can be found in the people we turn to; the ones who rejoice with us, bless us, encourage us, and support us. **Good relationships help us find joy in life.** This is how we were created, what we were meant for. To find joy in a community of relationships of shared life together. You are worthy of such love and belonging!

Questions Related to This Week's Message:


1. Where are you finding joy right now?
